#### Too much loss

Work "accidents" cause up to 1,600 deaths every year. These deaths include work-related suicide, road accidents while driving for work and any member of the public killed as a result of a workplace accident.

When you add in as many as 50,000 deaths from work-related illnesses – including cancers, respiratory illnesses, and heart disease – these numbers are way too high. This loss is even more tragic because 70% of workplace "accidents" could be avoided if health and safety was managed properly.

#### A culture change

Society no-longer finds drink-driving or domestic violence acceptable. UNISON is working to ensure that work-related ill-health, injury and death aren't just a tragic but accepted part of the world of work – because behind every statistic there is a tragedy affecting the victims, their families, friends and colleagues.

#### Background to International Workers Memorial Day (IWMD)

IWMD takes place across the world on 28 April each year, a day when many choose to wear a purple ribbon. The Day and the ribbon are about remembering the dead and renewing our demand for safe and healthy work to protect those still working – now and into the future.
